

**AP Human Geography**  
**Unit 3**  
**Religion Assignment**

This assignment has two main parts, and involves some on-line research on your own. This is also a *vocabulary review exercise*, so think of this as helping you apply and practice using key terms from the unit. Each person in class is being assigned two of the *minor* religions of the world, and it is your task to research them as fully as you can, and to fill out the accompanying worksheet (or something similar).

- (1) Be sure to provide a source list for your research, which includes any sources that you used while putting together this assignment! Including a list of website links is sufficient for this purpose.
- (2) As finding specific details for all the categories will be challenging for minor religions, you can receive “full” credit for adding more detail to some categories, in place of blank areas where you were unable to track down information. In other words, you not only earn credit for **completeness**, but also for **thoroughness**.

**Notes:**

*Spread* – where has this religion spread to, or if it hasn’t spread much, where is it practiced?

*Symbol* – pick one or two of the most distinctive and meaningful symbols. Do the symbols have cultural and/or historical meaning?

*Type* includes whether this is a universalizing or a folk religion, as well as mono/polytheistic.

*Hierarchy* refers to how the religion is organized. Is there a well-run bureaucracy? Is it highly individualistic?

Is it something in between, without a single person (or single group) in charge?

*Holy Book* – is there a single book, or a core set of venerated religious writings?

*Major Beliefs* – key beliefs of the religion that you think are interesting, memorable, and/or significant.

*Sacred Places* – are there any sites or places that have special meaning to members of this religion?

*Places of Worship* – how are the temples/shrines/churches of this religion designed? What do they look like?

Do they have a particular shape that happens to be meaningful?

*Calendar* – does this religion have its own calendar, and if so, how does it match up to the “Common Era” calendar in standard use around the world today?

*Treatment of Dead* – what are the funeral practices of this religion? What do they do with the bodies of the deceased? Although technically one of the major beliefs of a religion, this tends to be highly specific and important to many religions, and often can have very strong folk or universalizing roots.
